New recyclable book bags will be offered to library customers as an affordable and green bag alternative beginning Wednesday, July 30. The bags are \$1.50 (including tax) and made out of recycled material. They will be stocked in all branches of the Prince George's County Memorial Library System in an effort to promote a green and sustainable future.

The bags feature the Library logo and the message 'Read-Reuse-Recycle.' Made from a sturdy non-woven material, the bags are 100% recyclable and reusable. These tear resistant and water repellent bags are made from recycled polypropylene.

"Libraries are inherently green; we promote reuse everyday and are eager to do all we can to support the Going Green initiative of Prince George's County," said Library Director Micki Freeny.
